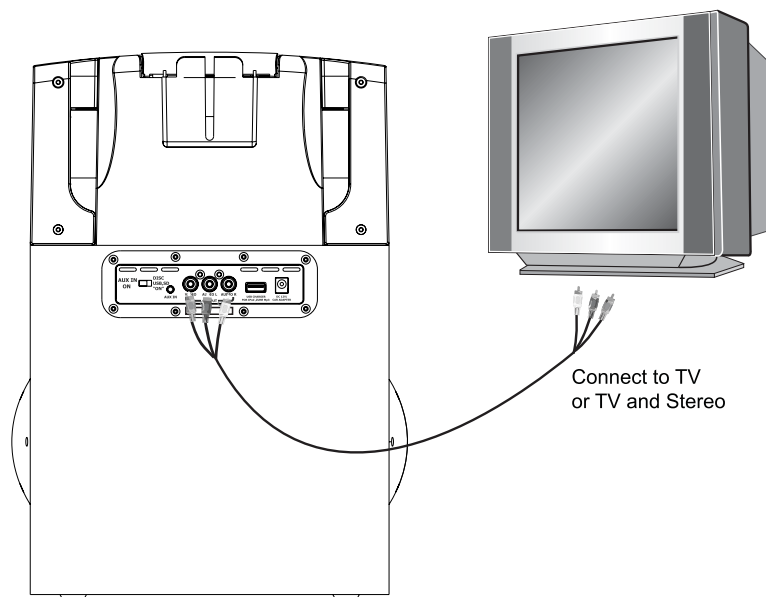

Connecting to a TV Set

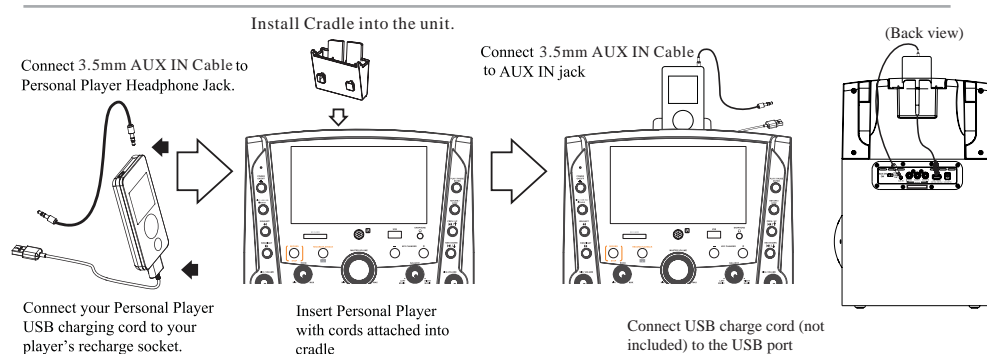

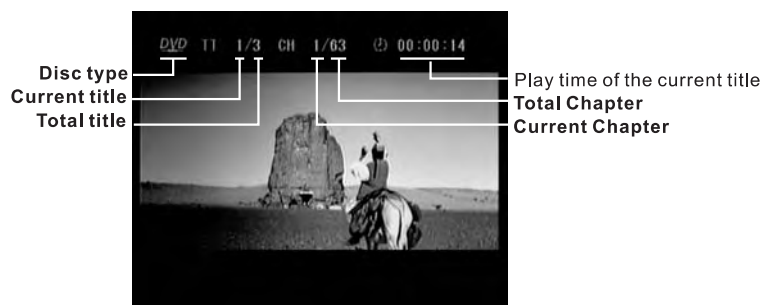

The SCREEN SAVER function is automatically and always on; when the player is in STOP, after few minutes in Open or No disc state, it will appear a DVD logo moving around the screen.

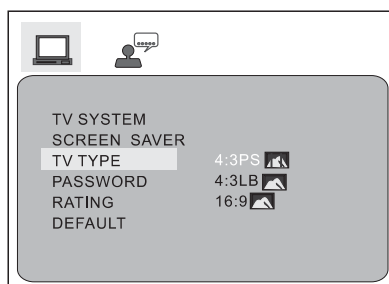

1.4 PASSWORD

The password option is initialized locked, and you can not set the ratings limit or change the password. In order to set the Ratings feature to work, the password mode must be turned on. If you want to set the ratings limit, you will need to enter the default password, which is 0000, then press OK to confirm. To change the password, you will be prompted for the old password, then be prompted for a new one. Enter a 4-digit number (this is your password). Press remember your PASSWORD, as the DEFAULT setting will revert everything.

1.5 RATING

The Rating feature is a rating limit system, like movie ratings. It works with DVD discs that have been assigned a rating. This helps you control the types for DVDs that your family watches.

1.6 DEFAULT

The DEFAULT setup options are RESTORE factory setup.

When your unit does not work properly, it may probably result from some wrong settings. Please try the Restore Factory Setting function to see if the unit can restore to its normal working status.
