- 5. Water and Moisture: Do not use this unit near water. For example, do not use near a bath tub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub. Do not use this unit in a wet basement or near a swimming pool or similar location. The unit shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids (ex: vases), shall be placed on or near this unit.
- 6. Cleaning: Clean the unit only with a dry cloth. Unit must be unplugged from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners on the unit.
- 7. Ventilation: Slots and openings in the cabinet of the unit are provided to ensure reliable operation and ventilation and to protect the unit from overheating. The openings must not be covered and should never be blocked by placing the product on a soft surface like a bed, sofa, or rug. This unit should not be placed in a built-in installation like a bookcase or rack, unless proper ventilation is provided.
- **8. Heat:** Do not install the unit near any heat source like a radiator, heat register, stove or other device that produces heat, including amplifiers.
- 9. Grounding or Polarization: If applicable, do not disable or circumvent the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has 2 blades with 1 wider than the other. A grounding-type plug has 2 blades and a 3rd grounding plug. The wide blade, or the 3rd prong, is provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into an outlet, consult a qualified electrician for replacement of this outlet.
- **10. Power Cord Protection:** Protect the power cord from being walked on, pinched or cut or damaged in any





- 13. Lightning: Unplug this unit and disconnect the antenna or cable system during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time. This will help prevent damage to the unit due to lightning and power line surges.
- 14. Servicing: Do not attempt to service this unit yourself. Opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to a qualified service technician.
- 15. Power Sources: Only connect to the type of household power supply as indicated in the operations manual and "Caution Marking and Rating Label." If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home (or location of the outlet the unit is being plugged into), consult with the local power company. For units intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the manufacturer's operations manual.
- **16. Overloading:** Do not overload wall outlets or extension cords. This can result in a risk of fire or electric shock and may be hazardous.
- 17. Foreign Material: Protect this unit from intrusion of any foreign substances like dirt, water, moisture and insects. Do not force any foreign materials or chemicals into this unit. This could result in a risk of fire or electric shock and may be hazardous.


- **20. Wall or Ceiling Mounted:** The unit should be mounted to a wall or a ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.
- 21. Disconnect Device: Make sure all disconnect devices are in proper working condition and readily available in the event of an emergency or if power "off" is needed quickly.
- 22. Protective Attachment Plug: If applicable, this unit may be equipped with an attachment plug having overload protection. This is a safety feature. See the operations manual for replacement or resetting of this protective device. If replacement of the plug is required, be sure the qualified service technician has used a replacement plug specified by the manufacturer that has the same overload protection as the original plug.
- 23. Power Lines: An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. 

Front Control




Rear Control



Power

Plug the small end of included AC power adapter into the unit and the adapter into the power outlet.




Plug unit in and press **POWER** button. **POWER** indicator will light up. Insert disc or Connect your Smart Device to **AUX IN** jack. Adjust **MASTER VOLUME** to desired sound level.

Connect to a TV/DVD/External Device

Connecting For Video

Requires an RCA Audio/Video Cable (included).

- Plug the yellow end of the included RCA Audio/Video Cable:
 - Unit: Video Output
 - TV: Video Input
- 2. Adjust the TV to the correct Input setting.
- When playing CD+G disc, the karaoke player will output written lyrics to the connected TV.



Play CD+G or CD's

Loading a Disc

- 1. Pull the **OPEN/CLOSE** area to open the **CD DOOR**.
- 2. Place a CD+G or CD into the CD compartment.
- Close the CD DOOR.

Playing a Disc

- 1. Load a Disc;
- 2. Adjust the SOURCE switch to CD+G or CD.
- 3. Press the **PLAY/PAUSE** button to begin playing the loaded disc. The **PLAY/PAUSE** indicator will light up.
- To temporarily stop playing, press the PLAY/PAUSE button once (indicator light will flash). To resume play, press the PLAY/PAUSE button one more time.
- 5. Press **SKIP/SEARCH** button to skip between next or previous tracks.
- Hold the SKIP/SEARCH button to fast search through the tracks.
 Please note: The fast-forward and fast-rewind functions will not work for CD+G discs.
- 7. Press the **STOP** button to stop playing.

Repeat Function

- 1. Load a Disc.
- 2. Adjust the **SOURCE** switch to CD+G or CD.
- 3. Press the **REPEAT** button once (indicator light will flash). The unit will play the current track repeatedly.
- 4. Press the **REPEAT** button twice (indicator light will light up). The unit will play the entire disc repeatedly.
- 5. To cancel the **REPEAT** function: Press the **REPEAT** button repeatedly (indicator light will turn off) or press the **STOP** button twice.

Programming a Disc


- 1. Load and Play a Disc.
- In CD/CD+G STOP mode, press the PROGRAM button and the program indicator will flash.
- 3. Press the **SKIP/SEARCH** buttons to select the track you wish to play first.
- 4. Press the PROGRAM button to confirm.
- 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 to program up to 20 tracks to play in a specified order.
- Press the PLAY button to start the program playing. The PROGRAM indicator light will flash.
- 7. Press the **STOP** button twice to cancel programming.

RCA Audio Output and AUX Input

RCA Audio Output

Requires an RCA Audio/Video Cable (included)


- Plug the Red & White end of the RCA Audio/Video Cable into the RCA AUDIO OUTPUT and an RCA Audio Input on a TV or Stereo system.
 - · Unit: Audio Output L/R
 - TV: Audio Input L/R
- 2. Adjust the TV or stereo system to the correct input setting.
- When playing disc, the karaoke player will output audio to the connected TV or stereo system.



3.5mm AUX Input(AUDIO IN/LINE IN)

Requires a 3.5mm AUX IN Cable (included)

- Connect the AUX IN Cable to the AUX IN Jack on the back of the unit;
 Connect the other end to the AUDIO OUTPUT Jacks on the External Audio Source
- 2. Adjust the **FUNCTION** switch to **AUX IN/MP3** mode.
- You will use the External Device to select music and adjust the volume to the maximum level. You can now control the volume with the karaoke unit.



Echo, Balance, Headphones and Microphone

Echo

Use the **ECHO** Control Feature to enhance your voice for a concert hall effect.

Balance

Use the **BALANCE** Control Feature to switch between the pre-recorded singer's voice and the music, when using a Multiplex Karaoke Disc.


Connecting Headphones

Connect low impedance 3.5mm (maximum 32ohm) stereo headphones (not included) to the Headphone Jack. The speaker is automatically disconnected when the headphones are plugged in.

Connecting a Microphone

Requires a Microphone (included).

- 1. Plug the Microphone into the MIC 1 INPUT or MIC 2 INPUT.
- 2. Use the **MICROPHONE VOLUME**Control to adjust the volume of audio amplified from the microphone.



Karaoke Glossary of Terms

In addition to all of the terminology associated with consumer electronics products, a few additional terms are used almost exclusively in karaoke. These terms are meant to familiarize you with the world of karaoke. The features listed below may not necessarily apply to the particular model that you have. The following are some brief explanations:

Echo:

Echo adds depth and resonance to a singer's voice without affecting the music. This echo is produced by creating minor controlled feedback in the singer's voice.

Multiplex:

A multiplex CD+G is really three recordings on one CD+G. The right channel has a mono recording which allows you to sing a duet with the lead singer. The left channel has a mono recording of the same music, WITHOUT the lead singer. Multiplex control allows the singer to gradually go from left channel to right channel, thereby gradually fading out the vocal.

Multiplex Karaoke Disc (CD+G)

Multiplex Karaoke Disc (CD+G) is when music is on the left balance side and vocals are on the right balance side.

Regular Karaoke CD+G

Regular Karaoke CD+G only have music WITHOUT Vocals on them. Check CD+G verbiage before buying to get the correct Disc your want. All CD+G have Lyrics on TV.

CD+G:

This is an acronym for Compact Disc plus Graphics. You will also see variations CD+G, and CD + Graphics. This is a regular CD with information stored on a data track simultaneous to music. In laymen's terms. CD+G has a video output for simple graphics (not full motion video). In the case of karaoke, the graphics function is used to store song lyrics and display the lyrics in sync with music. In most cases, CD+G software displays lyrics which change color swiped as they are to be sunq. A TV with a Video In RCA Jack is all that is required to display CD+G lyrics.

Caring for Compact Discs

• Treat the disc carefully and handle only by its edges. Never allow your fingers to come in contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the disc.



- Do not attach adhesive tape, stickers, etc. to the disc label.
- Clean the disc periodically with a soft, lint-free, dry cloth. Never use detergents or abrasive cleaners to clean. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.
- If a disc skips or gets stuck on a section, it is probably dirty or damaged (scratched).
- When cleaning, wipe in straight lines from the center to the outer edge of the disc. Never wipe in circular motions.



- This unit is designed to play CD/CD+G bearing the identification logo as shown here. Other discs may not conform to the CD standard and may not play properly.
- Compact Discs should be stored in their cases after each use to avoid damage.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, high temperatures or dust, etc. Prolonged exposure or extreme temperatures can warp the compact disc.
- Do not stick or write anything on either side of the compact disc. Sharp writing instruments, or the ink, may damage the surface.

Cleaning the Unit

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect your unit from the AC power source when cleaning.
- The finish on your unit may be cleaned with a dust cloth and cared for as other furniture. Use caution when cleaning and wiping the plastic parts.
- Mild soap and a damp cloth may be used on the front panel.
