Warnings and Precautions

WARNING: To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose this unit to rain or moisture.

CAUTION: Use of controls or adjustments or performance of procedures other than those specified may result in hazardous radiation exposure.

"Caution Marking and Rating Label" is affixed under the lid or on the bottom of the unit with a mass not exceeding 7kg.

SAFETY

For units with an insertable AC Power Adapter cordset:

- The power adapter should remain operable for its intended use. Disconnect the AC Power Adapter if you are not intending to use the unit for a long period of time.
- When connecting or disconnecting the AC Power Adapter Cord, grip the plug and not the cord itself. Pulling the cord may cause damage and create a hazard.

For units with a Rechargeable Battery:

Important Safety Instructions

1. Read These Instructions: All safety and operations manual should be read before the product is operated.

2. Keep These Instructions: The safety and operations manual should be retained for future reference.

3. Heed All Warnings: All warnings applicable to the unit and in the operations manual should be adhered to.

4. Follow All Instructions: All operations manual should be followed.

5. Water and Moisture: Do not use this unit near water. For example, do not use near a bath tub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub. Do not use this unit in a wet basement or near a swimming pool or similar location. The unit shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids (ex: vases), shall be placed on or near this unit.

6. Cleaning: Clean the unit only with a dry cloth. Unit must be unplugged from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners on the unit.

7. Ventilation: Slots and openings in the cabinet of the unit are provided to ensure reliable operation and ventilation and to protect the unit from overheating. The openings must not be covered and should never be blocked by placing the product on a soft surface like a bed, sofa, or rug. This unit should not be placed in a built-in installation like a bookcase or rack, unless proper ventilation is provided.

8. Heat: Do not install the unit near any heat source like a radiator, heat register, stove or other device that produces heat, including amplifiers.

9. Grounding or Polarization: If applicable, do not disable or circumvent the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has 2 blades with 1 wider than the other. 10. Power Cord Protection: Protect the power cord from being walked on, pinched or cut or damaged in any

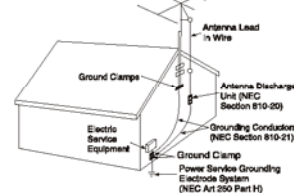

For units intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the manufacturer's operations manual.

16. Overloading: Do not overload wall outlets or extension cords. This can result in a risk of fire or electric shock and may be hazardous.

17. Foreign Material: Protect this unit from intrusion of any foreign substances like dirt, water, moisture and insects. Do not force any foreign materials or chemicals into this unit. This could result in a risk of fire or electric shock and may be hazardous.

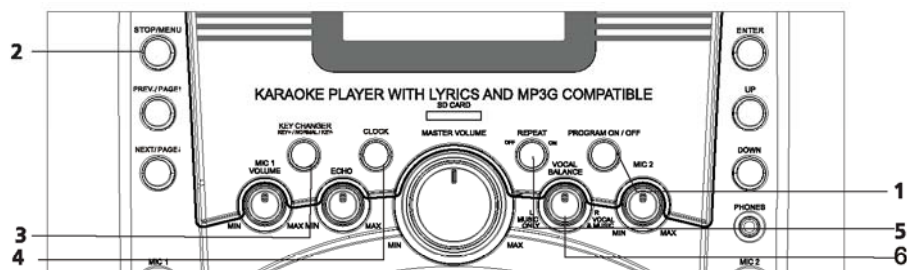
Controls



1. Press the **POWER** button to turn the player ON, song listing should appear automatically.
2. Press **PREV./PAGE↑** or **NEXT/PAGE↓** to navigate through song list (by page), then press UP or DOWN (one by one) to select the specific song.
3. Press **PLAY/PAUSE** to choose or stop a song.
4. Adjust **VOCAL BALANCE** to increase or decrease vocal output.
Adjust **Vocal Balance Control** to (-) to remove vocals from music playing.
Adjust **Vocal Balance Control** to (+) to increase vocals from music playing.
5. Press **ENTER** to Confirm your selection or play.
6. Press **PREV** or **NEXT** to skip to the next songs.

*When playing a song, lyrics will scroll upwards off screen.

Controls



1. PROGRAM

Press PROGRAM to turn it ON. Select songs through song list, go to the song you wish to play, press ENTER (the song name blinks). Then go to another song, ENTER again (song name blinks), repeat these steps to add more songs, then enter PLAY play songs you have selected. Press PROGRAM again to turn the function OFF.

2. STOP/MENU

Press STOP button to stop playing and go to the song list

Press MENU button once to enter the selection screen, using Up and Down buttons.

Press ENTER to select a desire function;

3. KEY CHANGER:

Press the button to increase or decrease the pitch, in circulation like: KEY+1, KEY+2, KEY+3, KEY-1, KEY-2, KEY-3

4. CLOCK

Press this button will display the clock

5. REPEAT:

Press the button to repeat the song selected, or repeat the whole song list.

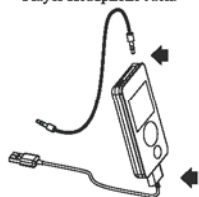
Press it again to cancel the Repeat function.

6. VOCAL BALANCE:

Turn knob to the left to gradually cancel vocals and hear music only. Turn the knob to the right to increase vocals.

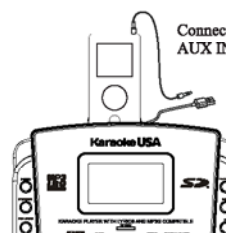

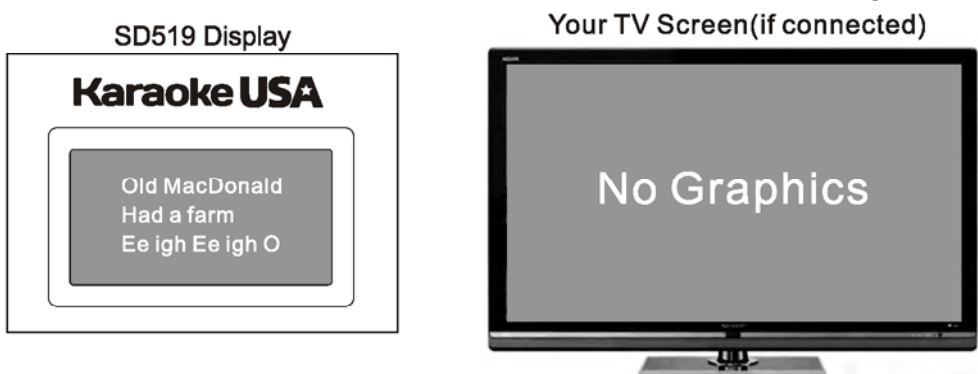
Display Scenarios

This SD519 unit contains pre-loaded songs in two formats: MP3 with LRC (Lyrics) file and MP3G. This allows lyrics to be viewed on both the SD519 display screen and your TV if you choose to connect. Likewise, if your SD Card contains songs in both MP3.LRC and MP3G formats, lyrics will display on screen and on your TV as well. If your SD Card only contains MP3.LRC formatted song lyrics can only be viewed on the SD519 display, not your TV screen. If your SD Card only contains MP3G formatted songs lyrics can be viewed on your TV, but not the SD519 display. If your SD Card contains only MP3 songs, lyrics are not available for either the SD519 display or your TV screen.

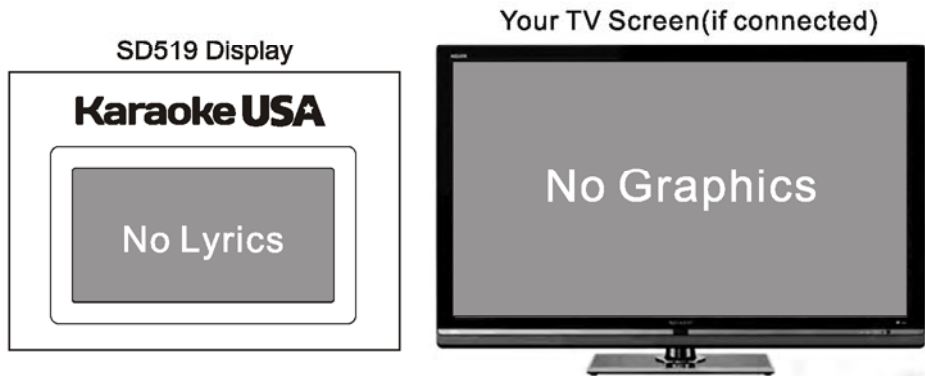

WORKING WITH MP3 AND LRC FILES

MP3 files may be intimidating to some. They are nothing more than computer files that can be moved, copied, stored and deleted. When made available for an MP3 player to access, great sound is the result. MP3 files are the most common format of downloadable music on the internet.

Your player comes with 200 songs preloaded. (please see page 4 for the song list)

**You can always download additional music songs by using a SD card
(any size up to 16G flash memory)**

- 1. From your own computer or laptop, download any stored songs/music in the hard disc into the SD card.(please apply .MP3 format of the music);**
- 2. From the internet. There are many Internet sites that you can find MP3 Karaoke songs & titles for download into your SD card.**
- 3. There are a large number of good Mp3 music on our web-site that you can download from.Please go to www.singthehits.com for karaoke songs.We do not sell music and do not offer them anything free.**

WORKING WITH MP3 AND LRC (LYRIC) FILES

Your player will play MP3 files with an added benefit. If a matching LRC file is provided, you can view the lyrics to your MP3 song on the player's lyric display. However, LRC files are not necessary to listen to great music or to sing along as karaoke. An LRC file is nothing more than a text file with timing marks inserted before each line of lyrics. The timing marks tell the player when to insert the line of lyrics into the display as the song is played.

MP3 and matching LRC files may be found searching the internet. Whether you decide to download, share or create your own lyrics file, you must follow one simple rule. The MP3 and LRC filenames must be exactly the same except for the extensions *.MP3 and *.LRC. If they are exactly the same, the player will know to access both automatically. You don't have to do anything extra like tell the player you have a lyrics file. It automatically searches each time an MP3 is played.

Songs, music and lyrics are created by real people like musicians and song-writers. Their work is considered intellectual property. Even though MP3 files are easily accessible and shared often, you are still responsible to abide by copyright laws. We neither advertise or promote violation(s) of copyright laws.

This unit designed to play MP3 music with LRC File (Lyrics) or MP3 or MP3+G music

The LCD can play the lyrics on screen.



Power On/Off

Press ON/OFF key once to on or off.

* When the unit is turned on, it will display the song list.



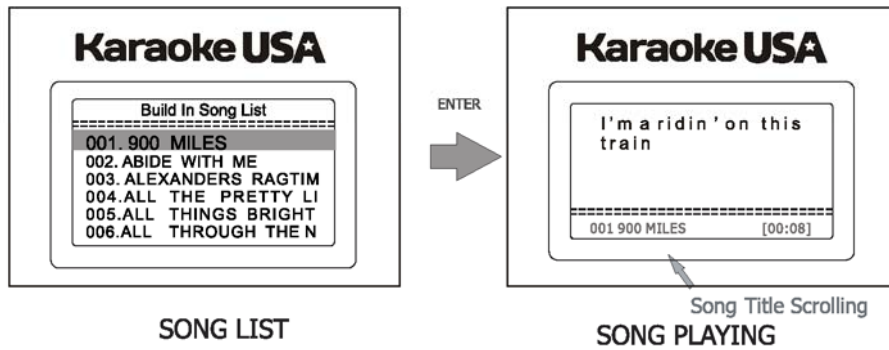
* Press ENTER to directly play the current selected song (default setting is 1st song)

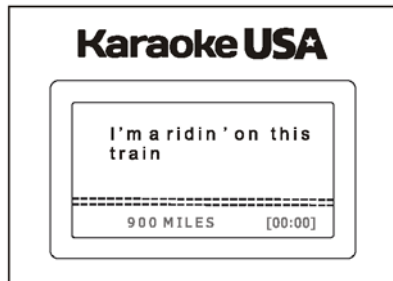


- * Lyric will be displayed on screen and scroll upward.

- * Press **PAUSE** to suspend the music and press **PLAY** to resume (status on LCD)

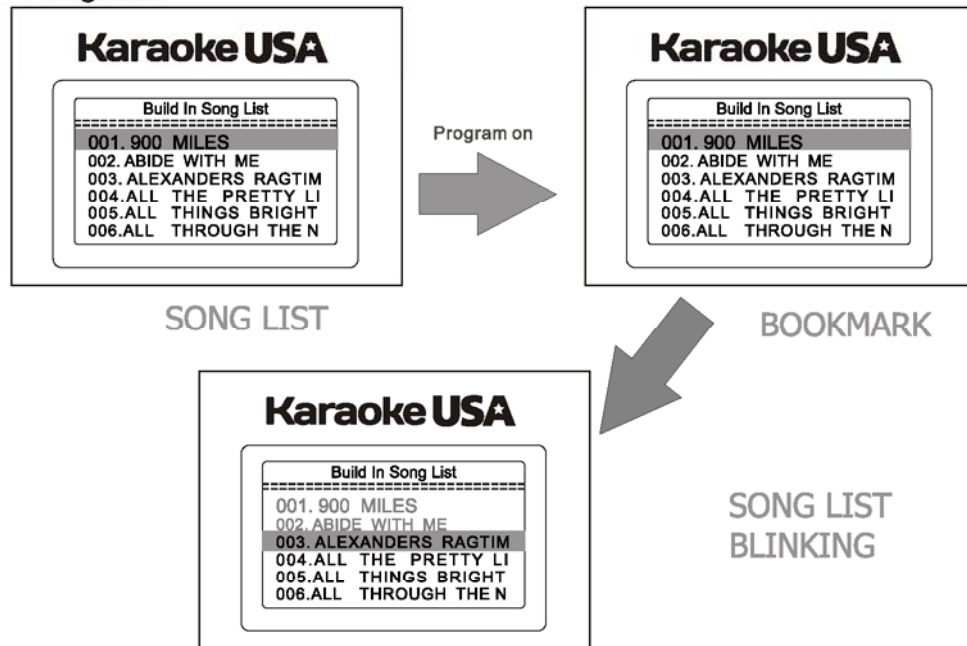

PROGRAM On/Off - - Press PROGRAM ON/OFF button to start the program in the song list. Select your favor song and Press ENTER (song bookmarked). The song you selected will be blinked on the screen. Press UP & DOWN to scroll through the song list and press ENTER to mark next song, Press ENTER again to remove it from bookmark list. After marking all songs, press PLAY to play those selected songs;

Play SD Card

Before you do this, make sure there are some MP3 format musics stored in your SD card.

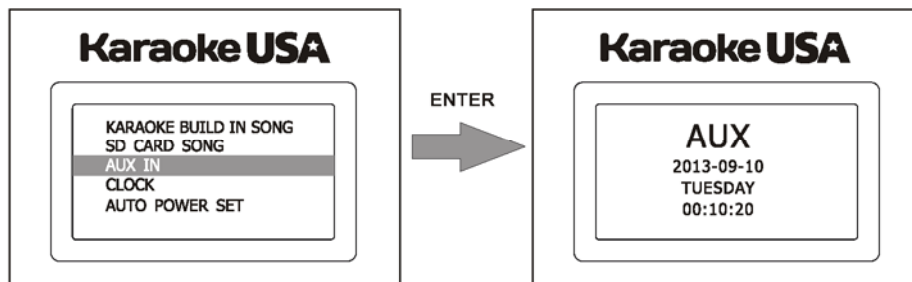


*Insert your SD card to the SD card slot, then press MENU, press ▼ to select the SD CARD SONG, press ENTER again to go to the songs that stored in your SD card.

*If you want watch the lyric by your own download songs, you have to download the LCR. file or MP3G file, but the files name must be EXACTLY same as the songs name, so that you can watch the lyrics on the unit screen or the connected TV.

AUX IN

*Plug your ipod or your portable player through the cable to the MP3/iPOD/AUX IN port on the back of the unit.
(cable provided in the package)



*Press MENU, then press ▼ to select the AUX IN, press ENTER again to listen your external player's music.

*Audio from your iPod or MP3/Mp4 player will be mixed with the singer's voice and be played through the player's speaker.

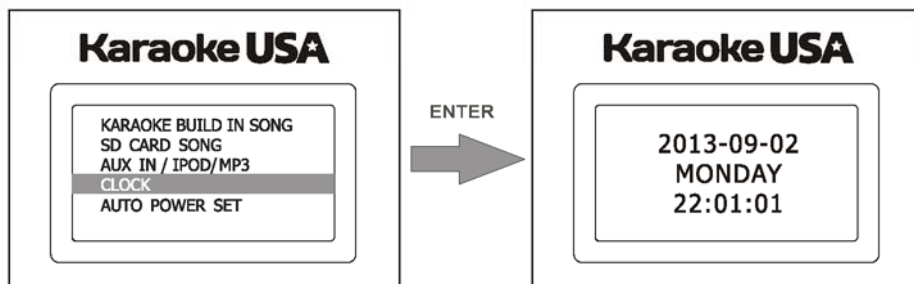

*Press MENU once to enter mode selection screen.

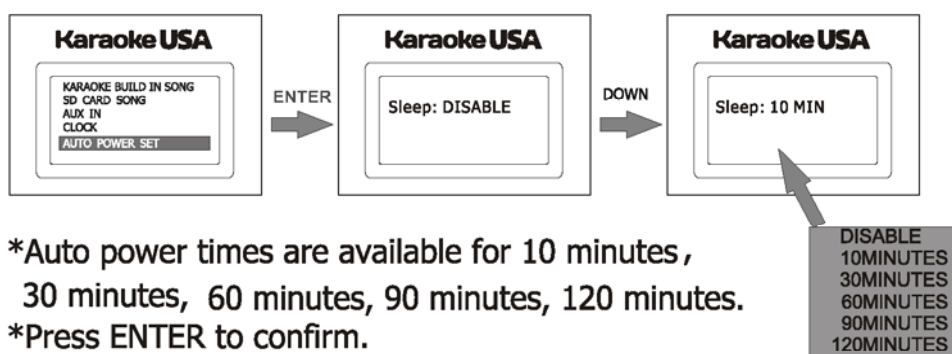
*The sequence is Year > Month > Day> Hour > Minute.

- *Press UP or DOWN to change auto power off time.



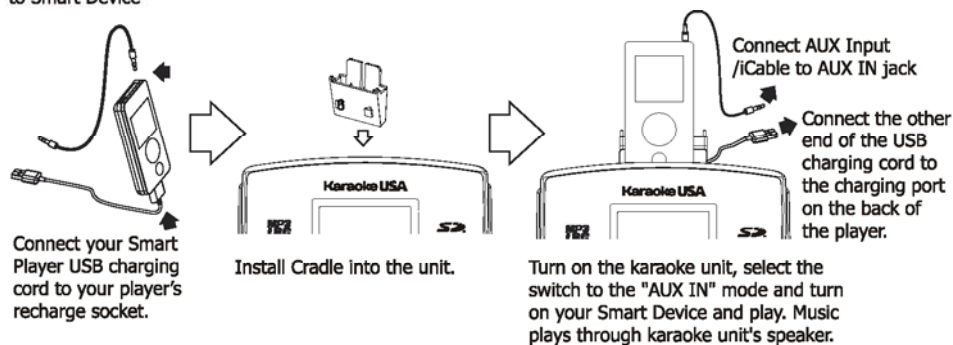
- *Auto power times are available for 10 minutes, 30 minutes, 60 minutes, 90 minutes, 120 minutes.

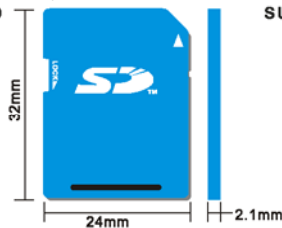


Troubleshooting

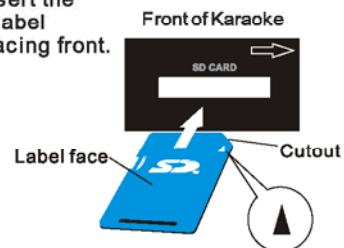
Symptom	Possible Solutions
Can't turn on.	Check Battery polarities being installed correctly Check if AC Adaptor is functioning.
Can't play Music.	Check if the Power is turned ON. Are the Music files in MP3 format? Check if the Music files are intact.
Music file is played but no sound output.	Adjust the Volume Control up to desire level for listening. Check if the music files are intact.
No sound output after iPod is hooked up	Check if the Connecting cable between iPod and Unit is damaged. Check if iPod and Unit is connected correctly. (Please refer to the Manual for proper connection) Set the unit at the proper mode.
Can't Play Music files in SD card.	Check if the SD card is inserted correctly sticker upwards. Make sure the music on your SD card is.mp3 format.
If your Unit doesn't respond or displays strange characters and symbols, you are recommended to RESET the Machine at the back with a Pin. (Note: The Time and Program setting will be lost!)	

SD CARD

* Use the SD Card which meets SD standards. If not, it may cause the Karaoke to malfunction.



* Gently insert the SD Card label surface facing front.



* Compliant card type: SDHC Card, SD Card, miniSD Card, miniSDHC Card, microSD Card, microSDHC Card (requiring miniSD Card/miniSDHC Card/microSD Card/microSDHC Card adapter)
